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The Second Sunday of Advent – Peace

Last week was the First Sunday of Advent, which was the Sunday of Hope. Today is the Second Sunday of Advent – the Sunday of Peace.

Praise be to the Lord, the God of Israel, because he has come to his people and redeemed them. Luke 1:68

Reader: Our peace is found in God and in his Son, Jesus Christ. John the Baptist and all the prophets remind us – that to receive peace we must be prepared for it.

Reader: We light this candle today to remind us that Christ is the Prince of Peace – he is the one promised from the beginning of the world. We thank God for the hope he gives us and for the peace he bestows.

Light the First and Second Candles.

O God of Peace, Emmanuel, we pray that you will send your light into our hearts during this season of Advent. Help us to be ready for the day and the hour of Christ's appearing. Work in our hearts and help us to prepare for the peace that he brings – the inner peace that tells us that we are united with you – and the outer peace which will come when he returns to judge the world. Amen.

Therefore, Father, according to his command,

**we remember his death,
we proclaim his resurrection,
we await his coming in glory;**

and we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.

We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts, that they may be the sacrament of the body of Christ and his blood of the new covenant.

Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we, made acceptable in him, may be sanctified by the Holy Spirit.

In the fullness of time, reconcile all things in Christ, and make them new, and bring us to that city of light where you dwell with all your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation; by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, almighty Father, now and for ever. **Amen.**
